AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

At the end of the **three year** course of study, the candidate will be expected to:

- 1. have knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the religious, cultural, historical and social background of the biblical materials provided to be studied;
- 2. understand the nature of biblical moral lessons in the selected passages/themes from the Bible and the extent of their relevance and possible application to present day social, political, religious and cultural life and existence;
- 3. identify difficulties involved in the application of healthy attitudes, concepts and skills acquired from the Bible in ensuring peaceful co-existence and national development.

EXAMINATION SCHEME

There will be **two** papers - Paper 1 and 2 both of which must be taken.

- Paper 1: Will be 60 minutes multiple choice (objective) test paper consisting of **fifty** (50) questions drawn from the entire Christian Religious Studies syllabus. Candidates will be required to attempt all the questions for a total of **40 marks**.
- Paper 2: Will be essay test paper consisting of three sections A, B and C. Four questions each will be set in Sections A and B and two questions in Section C. Candidates will be required to answer **four questions** in all choosing at least **one** question from each section and the **fourth** from **either Section A or B** for a total of 60 marks.

The sections on the question paper will cover the following portions of the of the syllabus:

Section C: Themes from the Acts of the Apostles, James and I Peter

The Revised Standard Version of the Bible will be used in the setting of questions.
